All About Ag and the Environment! - Food, Land and People Educator and Facilitator Training, Positively Pollination and School/Community Gardening Workshop!

This class is open to anyone looking to gain experience in the area of environmental education. Join facilitator Elizabeth McNulty with the Kentucky Department of Agriculture, Agriculture Education Program, as she leads you through one and/or two fun-filled days of hands on learning. Teachers in attendance will gain professional development hours and also program guidance in core content areas and national standards. Project Food, Land & People promotes approaches to learning to help people better understand the interrelationships among agriculture, the environment and people of the world. Wednesday, July 7th, 2010 will be the facilitators training and Thursday, July 8th, 2010 will be the educator workshop. Those facilitators trained on Wednesday are encouraged to stay and watch an educator workshop in action on Thursday, July 8th.

Along with the Food, Land and People curriculum, participants will learn more about pollinators and the important role they play via a Positively Pollination curriculum training. Why pollination? Did you know, for example, that at least 80% of our world's crop plant species require pollination. Estimates as high as 1 out of every 3rd bite of food comes to us through the work of animal pollinators. If you're seeking more information on how to help our pollinators and/or activities and avenues for pollinator related activities for the classroom and beyond, then don't miss out! Learn about the honey bee disappearances and ways to help along with how to build a pollinator garden, the connection between pollinators and chocolate, pollinator friendly meal ideas, resources available for your use and much, much more!
